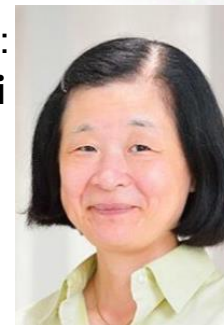

# Questions for the panel 1
